However, such directed readings are considered wholly supplementary and may not be applied toward the degree. Non-US M.A. students with undergraduate deficiencies in history may supplement formal course work by taking HIST 6940 (Directed Reading) with an individual faculty member. No more than 3 hours of HIST 6940 may be applied toward the degree in non-U.S. fields.
